FROM THE ACTING RECTOR

10 July 2011

Dear Friends,

St Paul's apostolate was wide-ranging as he sought to strengthen his brothers and sisters in Christ. Letters were valuable as a means of communication but where possible he visited the Church communities around the Mediterranean.

The Archbishop of Canterbury's many-sided ministry includes visiting the Churches of the Anglican Communion. As bishop of the premier See in the Communion he "presides in charity", seeking to build bridges and offer encouragement in widely differing cultures. Not being a pope, he has few canonical powers outside England. But he is able to exercise moral authority. I have an immense respect for the present occupant of St Augustine's Chair, Dr Rowan Williams. He has great intellectual and spiritual gifts which he seeks to use for the benefit of all. Some may wish he would be one-sided in some of the debates now vigorous in the Church. I admire him for his resolution in seeking to hold us all together, tirelessly seeking to keep the lines of communication open between various groups. We must constantly pray that God may give him strength and wisdom.

Last month while in Kenya he spoke appreciatively of a church and community mobilisation project there which focuses on food security. In speaking to the people he said, "**Faith is not just ideas in your head, faith is not just feelings in your heart.....faith is the whole of a new life, making a difference to your lives, to your neighbours, to your community, by the grace and Spirit of God.**"
